COST OF LIVING SUPPORT ENERGY BILLS



USE AN AIR FRYER OR MICROWAVE INSTEAD OF AN OVEN

Ovens can be an inefficient way of cooking as they involve heating a relatively large space. Using a microwave, pressure cooker or air fryer instead could save money.

For example, since 1 October it costs 3p to heat up a frozen ready meal in a 800W (watts) microwave for seven minutes. It would cost 40p for 35 minutes in a 2000W oven, energy efficiency website Sust-it estimates.

SWITCH TO LED LIGHTBULBS

Lighting makes up 11% of the average UK household's energy consumption, according to The Energy Saving Trust and Which? Switching to LED bulbs can make a big difference.

A household using a dozen 40W incandescent or halogen bulbs for four hours a day could spend about £238 per year, Sust-it estimates. LED equivalents would cost £41.70 - a saving of £196.30 a year. LED bulbs can cost more, but have a longer lifespan and will save money over time.

TAKE CONTROL OF YOUR CENTRAL HEATING

Set your thermostat at the lowest comfortable temperature (often 18 to 21C).

Turning your thermostat down just one degree could cut bills by about £145 a year, the Energy Saving Trust says. This is based on a semi-detached house with the heating on between 7am-9am and 4pm-11pm on weekdays and between 7am-11am at weekends.

In smaller homes, like a terraced house or a flat, the savings will be lower.



INSULATE AND DRAUGHT-PROOF YOUR HOME

If your home is poorly insulated it will lose heat more easily and be harder to keep warm.

Insulation and draught-proofing to stop heat escaping around doors and windows helps trap heat.

Professional draught-proofing might cost about £225, the Energy Saving Trust says. However, it can save about £125 a year - based on a typical semi-detached home.



MAKE BETTER USE OF APPLIANCES

Washing machines and tumble dryers can be energy hungry, according to Emily Seymour. But there are ways to use them efficiently, she says.

Use any eco settings and turn your machine down - particularly if clothes aren't that dirty.

Washing clothes at 30C and using one less cycle a week could save £28 a year, the Energy Saving Trust says.



TAKE SHORTER SHOWERS

A typical household with gas heating will see about 12% of its energy bill used to heat water for showers, baths and taps, the Energy Saving Trust says.

However, if you have a power shower the saving could be less as you'll use more hot water.

Meanwhile, cutting your shower time from eight to four minutes could save £70 a year. This is based on five showers a week.

Households who primarily cook with an oven could save up to £604 a year by using more energy-efficient cooking methods, a study has found.

Researchers calculated the energy consumption of 83 appliances and compared the running costs with the cheapest alternative.

They found that the most energy-intensive cooking appliance is an electric oven, which typically costs 87p per day to run or £316 a year. However, a microwave costs just 8p per day - representing a potential saving of £287 per year. An air fryer would cost just £52 a year, a saving of £264.



The research by energy supplier Utilita also looked at how cooking methods can slash power consumption by up to 90 per cent and save an additional £317 a year. Batch cooking can bank £158 a year, using the correct sized pan with a lid saves £72, simmering rather than boiling £68 and not overfilling the kettle £19.

The table on the following page gives a rough idea about various ways to do this, the initial cost of each, and the ongoing cost of each.

They are all focused on just keeping your body warm, as opposed to your whole home.

ESSEX SUSTAINABLE WARMTH SCHEME

If you're an Essex homeowner with a household income below £30,000, you may be eligible for up to £10,000 of work to make energy efficient improvements to your home through the Sustainable Warmth Scheme. This was previously called the Green Homes Grant Local Authority Delivery Scheme.

Improvements covered by the scheme include insulation, heating, excluding gas and oil boilers, heating controls, ventilation, hot water systems, solar thermal, solar PV, and lighting.

The funding covers the entire cost of the improvements, up to £10,000.

ESSEX SUSTAINABLE WARMTH SCHEME

To be eligible for the scheme, you must own a home in Essex that is currently rated as Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) D, E, F or G, and have a household income below £30,000.

If you have a household income above £30,000, you may still be eligible if you or someone in your household receives:

Armed Forces Independence Payment - Attendance Allowance
Carer's Allowance - Child Tax Credit - Constant Attendance Allowance
Disability Living Allowance - Guaranteed Pension Credit
Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
Income-related Employment and Support Allowance - Income Support
Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit - Personal Independence Payment
Severe Disablement Allowance - Universal Credit
War Pensioners' Mobility Supplement - Working Tax Credit



ESSEX SUSTAINABLE WARMTH SCHEME

Funding is also available for private landlords, local authority-owned properties and social housing, however a 33% contribution from the landlord is required and the maximum funding per property is £5,000.
